
Eligibility:

- 1. Meet all the requirements as an active Key participant, as determined by the Key Community Coordinator and outlined in the Key Communities Student Agreement.
- 2. Be in good academic standing (2.0 cumulative GPA or above)
- 3. Be receiving Federal Loans as part of your financial aid package for the upcoming year <u>or</u> qualify for Colorado ASSET in-state tuition. (If you are unsure of your status, you can contact Student Financial Services at 970-491-6321)
- 4. Be currently in good judicial standing with the university (Students who have a <u>Loss of Good Standing</u> designation are **not** eligible to apply. Students who are on <u>General Disciplinary Probation</u> may apply and will need to respond to question 5 on the application.

How to Apply: After completing the CSUAS general application, hover over 'Opportunities' and then click, 'Ours'. In the search field type "Key Scholar Award" and then click on the link when it comes up!

14 awards will go to first year Key Students and 2 will be awarded to Key Plus Students.
