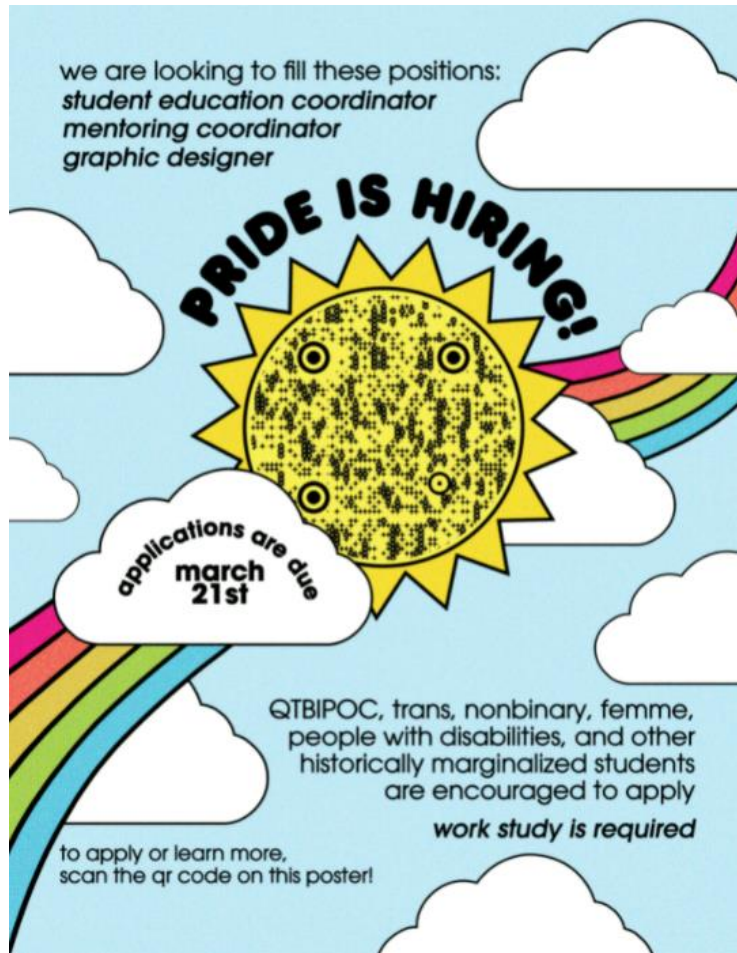
1. Meet all the requirements as an active Key participant, as determined by the Key Community Coordinator and outlined in the Key Communities Student Agreement.
